CUXTON FIREWORK DISPLAY, SATURDAY 5TH NOVEMBER 2022

Following recent meetings, The Wheel of Cuxton is pleased to advise we will be providing a Firework Display for our village this year. We will be maintaining the ticket costs at 2019 prices, and tickets will be available in advance of the display. Further details will be announced via the Cuxton Village Facebook page.

There have been requests for a quieter display, therefore this year we are going to experiment using some different fireworks. Whilst the budget for fireworks has been increased over our 2019 spend, overall we are planning a lower height and quieter (but not silent) display, to trial whether this is a direction we want to take the display in the future. Decisions regarding future displays will be discussed during our analysis meetings following the event.

The decision to proceed with this year's display has only been made recently, following discussions with the various companies, voluntary organisations and people we are reliant upon to help put the event together. This has therefore allowed just eight weeks to bring together what is normally planned over a year.

You may also notice a smaller bonfire this year – this is at the request of Cuxton Parish Council due to the cost of clearing up. Currently the company who have supported us with the supply of pallets for the fire for many years are fortunately so busy they are recycling all their pallets and therefore do not have any scrap pallets available. The committee is currently contacting companies who might be able to help, but if you know of anybody who could potentially help with the supply of pallets please get in contact.

Any volunteer organisation based within Cuxton is welcome to have a fundraising stall at our event. As we need to plan for all who are attending, if your organisation would like to have a stall on the night please contact us via email on <u>GJCCuxton@btinternet.com</u>. We also welcome any volunteers who would like to help us on 5th November. Please turn up at the Recreation Ground during the morning, we will be onsite from around 9am. All help will be greatly appreciated and if you can't make it on Saturday morning, we will also need assistance the following morning to clean the Recreation Ground and ensure that it is safe.

Finally, The Wheel of Cuxton Committee and on behalf of the whole village, would like to say a big 'Thank You' to Geoff Brinklow, who has stepped down from the committee, having helped with the Cuxton Firework Display for over 40 years without ever having lived in the village!
