

# THE WHEEL OF CUXTON FIREWORK DISPLAY 2022

Having had two years without a firework display in Cuxton, The Wheel of Cuxton would like to thank all of the people who supported this years' event.

The weather forecast for the evening was not great but in the end the weather was kind to us for the time of the display and the evening was well supported. The quality of the fireworks was fantastic, despite some of the content having been changed.

The firework display would not be able to happen without the vast number of volunteers who help to organise, set up on the day, carry out marshalling duties in the evening and clear up after the event. This not only involves taking down the equipment used but also drying out kit, carrying out repairs and putting it away so that it is ready for use next time it is needed. Also we would like to thank those who came to help litter pick the Recreation Ground after the event to make sure that it was clean and safe for others.

We did think we might have a problem with bonfire materials, but thanks to a couple of local companies and their drivers who were able to support us this year, we were able to continue. Our volunteers worked extremely hard in appalling weather conditions to make sure the materials were on site and ready for building the bonfire on the day of the display.

Cuxton Parish Council also helped us with sorting out the entertainment licence and liaising with Medway/Gravesham Council regarding the events notification and most importantly keeping the 'drowned rats' supplied with hot drinks whilst the bonfire materials were being delivered.

When it was set up over 60 years ago, the Wheel of Cuxton's original concept was to provide a safe village firework display so that people did not need to have their own private events. It was also an opportunity for charities and clubs in the village to raise some funds during the evening. The entrance money taken goes towards funding the following years display and over time we have good years and bad years, which are mainly weather dependant. Understandably, less people will want to come and stand in a muddy field on a wet night than on a dry field in better weather and despite a good turn out, this year was one of the not so good years and we haven't quite covered the costs of hosting the event.

If residents, who may have watched the display from their own homes because of the weather conditions, want to make a donation it would be gratefully accepted. However, the Wheel of Cuxton does appreciate the current economic climate places a further financial burden on households.

## **KENTISH WINE VAULT PLANNING INQUIRY**

The Parish Council and the local campaign group have joined together to successfully obtain *Rule 6 status* in the planning inquiry. This means we will be allowed to speak at the inquiry in March 2023. We have until December 8<sup>th</sup> to submit our 'Statement of Case' that will contain our concerns about the appeal and evidence to support our arguments.

The costs needed to engage a barrister to support our case is prohibitive and even a planning lawyer will cost between £20-30,000. However, we do have residents with relevant knowledge and skills who have offered to support and advise our team.
