### **MAY 2023 LOCAL ELECTIONS**

At the local elections in May, registered voters will be required to provide evidence of their identity before they will be issued with a ballot paper. As a result all voters will have to bring their photo driving licence or passport with them to the polling station if they wish to vote.

### VINEYARD PLANNING INQUIRY

The planning inquiry into the appeal against Medway Council's refusal of planning for the development of a visitor centre, café, restaurant and processing plant in Bush Valley, Upper Bush is scheduled to start on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> March 2023. A venue for the inquiry has yet to be identified, but it will be held in Medway.

The inquiry will be open to the public and details of how you can participate will be circulated once available. This will be an important opportunity for the community to make its' voice heard.

Cuxton Parish Council and the campaign group, Cuxton Against the Winery currently remain involved in the inquiry.
