
CUXTON PAVILION RE-DEVELOPMENT SURVEY RESULTS AND UPDATE

Many thanks to all the residents who took the time to complete the recent survey and share your views on the proposed pavilion redevelopment. We can confirm 217 responses were received in total out of 1120 surveys posted to residents.


However, following the discounting duplicated responses, those with no name and address details provided and the process of random sampling, there were 187 valid surveys of which 59% were in favour of the redevelopment and 41% were against.

53% were in favour of funding the costs through the precept and 47% were against.

The Parish Council read the full, anonymised comments shared by all respondents which included some thoughtful feedback and interesting suggestions. Thank you to all those who responded with feedback.

The Parish Council has considered all the responses and comments and have decided to defer the project at this time. We will continue to explore alternative funding options to cover more of the proposed costs and we may revisit this project in future when more funding opportunities become available.

The survey has informed the Parish Council of a number of possible ideas which we will be exploring further over the coming year. We will consider the costs of offering a refreshment kiosk and covered seating in the Recreation Ground, and new opportunities for local residents to meet to reduce loneliness and promote community cohesion. We will be talking to potential partners in the village to explore options for this.

In response to some of the survey comments, the Parish Council wants to clarify our remit and reach:

- The Parish Council is responsible for: the upkeep and use of the Recreation Ground; some woodland space (6 Acre Wood behind Woodhurst Close) and keeping streets clean in the village. We make decisions that affect the village, including how the village precept money will be spent. All Parish Councillors are volunteers.
- The Parish Council works with voluntary groups including: Cuxton Countryside Group; Cuxton 91 FC; the Wheel of Cuxton; Friends of Cuxton Library Gardens; Cuxton Open Gardens; Cuxton Allotment Association and the Scouts. We work alongside these organisations to help make the village a better place for everyone to live.
- The Parish Council own the Recreation ground but the Scout Hall, Church Hall and Social Club are all on private land and owned or run by voluntary organisations and therefore do not fall under the Parish Council's remit. The Parish Council work in collaboration with these organisations, for example the recent defibrillator familiarisation session, which was hosted at the Social Club.
- Highways are Medway Council's responsibility; however, we highlight concerns about the A228 and speed issues in Cuxton. We signpost to Medway Council any issues such as potholes in the village but the Parish Council are not responsible for fixing them.

Cuxton Parish Council is always keen to hear any ideas to improve the lives of Cuxton residents, so please let us know if you have any future projects for us to consider. You can do this by contacting Parish Councillors using the details on the back of the Noticeboard or attending a Council meeting. We will also be sure to keep residents informed of the progress we are making with any new initiatives.
