
During the afternoon, villagers took to social media to share updates of the sleigh's location and their own stories of how this wonderful tradition has been part of their family festivities for many years.

## **Cuxton Recreation Ground Pitch Awarded!**

Thanks to the efforts of Cuxton 91 football team, the FA have awarded the pitch at Cuxton Recreation ground 'Good Pitch' status.

Cuxton 91 first took over the care of the pitches in the village 13 years ago and have contributed nearly £15,000 of their own funds to pitch maintenance in that time.

Additionally, they have secured £29,000 of FA investment over the last 4 years and regularly have to provide reports and pitch condition updates as part of that arrangement. So, the award was a very welcome development for the club.



# **News from Ranscombe Farm Reserve**

We're aware it's been a long while since we last provided an update within the Cuxton Noticeboard, but hopefully you'll be hearing from us more regularly again from now on!

There has been a lot of work going on across the 130 ha (320 acres) of woodland this autumn and winter, thanks largely to a grant from the Veolia Environmental Fund. This has included 'haloing' of 18 mature Oak trees that were buried deep in



and suppressed by the Sweet Chestnut coppice and involved cutting down the trees immediately surrounding them to provide them with more light. This will hopefully allow them to recover and go on to live for many more years to come. There has also been further work to widen rides – the open routes through the woods that benefit a broad range of plants and insects – and this February we will be employing the services of a large heavy-duty forest mulching machine to remove tree stumps within the rides that will make their ongoing management a lot more straightforward. In certain areas we've also been continuing to remove sweet chestnut coppice from the woods, encouraging other tree species and so working to make these areas more diverse in their structure and mix of species.


In the woods at Mill Hill, closest to Cuxton, we will be using the mulching machine to grind out stumps at selected points along the main ride. This may look quite drastic at first, but it will allow us to manage these open areas much more effectively by annual mowing, and hopefully establish more of the chalk grassland habitat rich in wildflowers and butterflies that currently occupies the area at the eastern end.


