North Kent National Nature Reserve...

Some of the most significant sites for wildlife in North Kent are coming together to propose a new Partnership National Nature Reserve (NNR) located between Medway and Gravesend.

I hope you had a wonderful Easter with your friends and family. I am writing this Parish Council newsletter to give you an update as to what we have been up to at The Academy of Cuxton Schools, but also to explain what we have planned for the next few months.

As you will be aware, we have been busy advertising our new nursery and wrap around care. This will be opening come September. We have exciting developments taking place over the summer break, with refurbishment work happening to transform the current 'Beehive/Buzz' buildings. As always, I will send letter to any neighbours who may be impacted by the building work, particularly with regards to noise etc. We will be using the same company we have used over recent years to undertake the extensive work. We haven't been made aware of any negative impact on the community in the past so we are very much hoping this will once again be the case. If your child is turning 2 in the next academic year, please do not hesitate to contact us regarding our nursery provision. We would love to hear from you if we haven't already!

On the **28**th **June** from 3.30pm, we will be holding our annual summer fete. Over the last few years this has been a real success, with many members of our school community (past and present) attending. It would be lovely to promote the businesses within the village, at a wonderful community event.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the many members of our community who come into school on a voluntary basis and read with our children. Most year groups now have a volunteer, who comes in and listens to the children read. As a school, reading is a priority, as it honestly is 'the gateway to learning'. If you are able to give up some of your spare time to support us in this area, please do express an interest via the office. We can never have enough volunteer readers! With school budgets becoming more and more challenging, any additional support our children can receive is much appreciated.

We are also still in the search for 'experts' from our community to come in and work with our teachers, as part of their continued professional development. I know we have some training in the pipeline, which is great to hear.

Finally, I wanted to let you know that I meet regularly with the clerk of the Parish Council to discuss the updates from the village and share any school developments that may be of interest. I believe this is fundamental in ensuring that both the school and the Parish Council work together for the best of the children and the village.

As someone who has been part of the Cuxton community for a very long time, I know how important it is for us to work in cohesion. Our school value of 'community' is one we feel is well and truly embedded at all levels with pupils, staff, governance partners and parents. Working closely with our community is a fundamental curriculum driver for our school.

Vineyard Farms New Application

Cuxton Parish Council held a dedicated meeting, on 29th February, to receive a presentation from Vineyard Farms Limited, which was wellattended by over 20 residents.

Following the judgements of their planning appeal last July, Vineyard Farms asked to meet and discuss their latest ideas for an adjusted and scaled-down version of their winery.

Taking into consideration the findings of the Inspector, they have revised their plans and have been making presentations over the last few weeks to Medway Council planning department, the members and the local parish councils surrounding their vineyard.


CUXTON TINY TOTS
