# **Updates from Cuxton 91**

Cuxton 91 have a busy time coming up in the next couple of months as the football season draws to an end.

On 17th and 18th May we are holding our trophy presentations at Cuxton Social Club, everyone in our club receives a trophy to reward them for their efforts throughout the season.

We are also presenting two special awards -

- The Jamie Kolendo Cup to the top goal-scorer throughout the club.
- The Jack Lewis Award for outstanding contribution within the club.



On 21st May the social club, rec and school field pitches are all being reseeded. On 1st and 2nd June our annual youth tournament is being held at Strood Academy and Wednesday 5th June is our AGM at Cuxton Social Club.

Our community football club caters for Boys, Girls, Men, Ladies and Vets giving everyone an opportunity to play football and enjoy themselves. We run two soccer academies for boys and girls to give youngsters the chance to see if football is their thing.

## The Recreation Ground

Now that the weather is improving, the contractor is due to begin refreshing the paintwork on the playground fencing and the parish council will be able to resolve the outstanding issue with the vandalised piece of equipment. It is very sad that this relatively new item might have to be replaced due to the actions of some, especially as the main victims of this are the toddlers for whom there are currently fewer options for play.

Following the CCTV upgrades, there are several further plans being discussed to continually improve the different aspects of the recreation ground and we hope to gather some resident opinions next month, at The Big Lunch Event.

Many years ago, the parish decided to make this a dog-free area for the health and safety of users, many of whom are young children inexperienced with animals. The restriction has helped keep the park free of dog mess, allowing users to confidently enjoy the grass for games and picnics. # **Beacon Lighting**

The Cuxton beacon, situated on Church Hill, will be lit at 9.15pm on the evening of Thursday, 6<sup>th</sup> June.

At that moment, hundreds of beacons will be lit all over the country to pay tribute to all those who took part in D-Day and commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Normandy landings.



As part of the ceremony, the International Tribute will be read aloud as the beacon is lit. All are welcome to attend. The beacon site is at coordinates: 51.371238, 0.450359. The what3words reference is: owners.paints.shack. Please note the beacon site is only accessible by foot.



# Cuxton Open Gardens - June 16th 2024

The Cuxton Open Gardens event will be going ahead on the 16<sup>th</sup> June this year (that's the Sunday after the Cuxton Big Lunch).
