## Thursday 6th June - Beacon Lighting

The Cuxton beacon, situated on Church Hill, will be lit at 9.15pm on the evening of Thursday, 6<sup>th</sup> June, to pay tribute to all those who took part in D-Day and commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Normandy landings.

#### Wildlife Tower Unveiling

Many residents may have seen throughout the surrounding countryside, the building of monolithic birds of prey towers on vineyard land. At the end of April, two Parish Councillors, Cllr Manning and myself, attended the formal unveiling of said towers hosted by the winery in Luddesdown.

On a cold and drizzly Friday, we boarded minibuses heading down into the Luddesdown valley to be shown around and explained what, who, when and why. Funding for these six towers came from the Lower Thames Crossing as part of a biodiversity net-gain initiative.

The reason for their existence is to support a myriad of bird and bat life with purposeful gaps and holes leading to nesting boxes inside the tower structure. The size and scale of them have raised some controversy; however, they replace the barns and veteran trees we have lost over the years and are somewhat in keeping with local landmarks like the Darnley Mausoleum and the Larkin monument in Higham. Arguably the highlight of the trip was the difficulty of exiting a wet grassy valley in a humble minibus, after multiple attempts we were free.

Whilst these buildings will provide habitat, the reason for their existence is somewhat sad. With so few barns, barn owls have fewer nesting opportunities, and with so little ancient woodland and veteran trees raptors and bats have fewer places to roost. We must take these towers with a pinch of salt, that their very existence is an admission of years of countryside neglect and abuse over the centuries past. I would like to hope that by the time these towers have reached their end of life, we won't need to rebuild them because nature would have regained the balance it so desperately needs.
